Workers in non-right-to-work states make

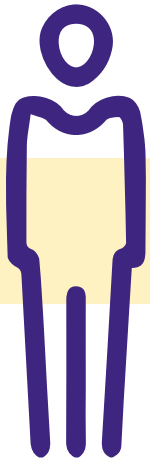

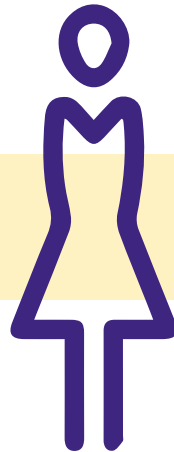
