Background: SEIU 521 has had a long history of growing our union membership and jurisdiction through external organizing. Our most recent victory with Childcare providers has grown our local by over 4,000 members and it continues to grow while also supporting the work of our amazing childcare provider members. This was a 20 year campaign and during that time our own SEIU Local 521 was supported by contributions from other SEIU locals from around the nation. Now there is a serious campaign to help grow the public sector division with a great campaign in the State of Virginia to organize over 20 thousand County workers throughout Virginia. The largest of which is in Fairfax County. Our additional \$250,000 contribution will support important work on these national priority campaigns and will benefit all SEIU members as we grow and build out power around the nation and specifically in the public sector. The majority of these workers are women and people of color that have not yet had an opportunity to have a union. Our contribution will support these workers in a very serious and potentially momentous outcome when we win. The Budget & Finance Committee approved this motion at their September 30, 2023 Meeting and recommends it to the Executive Board.
